Red Bank Regional High School (RBRHS), a comprehensive, four-year school, offers a highly acclaimed college-preparatory program to a diverse student body, and has repeatedly **ranked nationally for its success**.

RBRHS has been recognized for the **rigor and depth of its academic programs**. Our Dual Enrollment Program includes courses from Brookdale Community, Fairleigh Dickinson, Georgian Court, Rutgers, and Syracuse.

- 33.9% of juniors and seniors are enrolled in 1+ of our 10 Dual Enrollment classes.
- 39.9% of juniors and seniors are enrolled in 1+ of our 25 IB classes.
- 40.9% juniors and seniors are enrolled in 1+ of our 20 AP classes.
- 60.2% juniors and seniors are enrolled in +1 of our college-level classes; 53.4% seniors are enrolled in 1+ college level English Language Arts course.

Red Bank Regional is also home **to five CTE-certified Academies** and also offers a pathway program for students to earn the **International Baccalaureate Diploma Pathway**. Students from across the county must apply for limited spots via academic testing and auditions. Once accepted, students must complete a minimum of 8 course requirements in order to be an academy completer. The rigorous curriculum in each academy area allows students to develop relevant career skills while completing college-level work.

Red Bank Regional provides **one of the most comprehensive athletic programs** in Monmouth County. Most of our teams compete on Freshmen, JV, and Varsity levels. In addition, the school's 38 clubs and activities offer students a wide range of options to pursue their passions and enhance their total school experience.

RBRHS enrolls students from Little Silver, Shrewsbury and Red Bank communities in the regional school district. In addition, students from approximately 20 communities apply to our academy programs to complete our diverse student body. This suburban community is located in close proximity to the Jersey Shore in Monmouth County, New Jersey. The school is 49 miles from New York City and 85 miles from Philadelphia. Current enrollment is approximately 1300 students.

The modern and attractive campus occupies over 50 acres in Little Silver. The 200,000 square foot main building was recently upgraded with 16 new classrooms, a renovated library/media center, and state-of-the-art learning spaces.
