Red Bank Regional High School and Community

Red Bank Regional High School can trace its history back to 1901 when Red Bank High School was established. The Red Bank Regional High School District was formed on November 25, 1969 by the communities of Little Silver, Red Bank, and Shrewsbury. Construction of a new high school building started in the fall of 1972 and the first students attended the new facilities in the 1975-76 school year.

The modern and attractive campus occupies over 50 acres in Little Silver. The 200,000 square foot main building was recently upgraded with 16 new classrooms, a renovated library/media center, and state-of-the-art learning spaces. RBR's athletic facilities include a new synthetic turf field, modern fitness center, and an expansive "field house" with three basketball courts and an indoor running track. Current enrollment is approximately 1,300 students, is socio-economically diverse and includes students from throughout Monmouth County as well as the three original sending districts.

The RBR has been recognized for the rigor and depth of its academic programs. Over 65 percent of RBR seniors and juniors take at least one AP or IB course and RBR's rigorous curriculum features 22 Advanced Placement and 25 International Baccalaureate Courses, including the IB Diploma Program. Red Bank is also home to five CTE-certified Academies, including Monmouth County's only dedicated arts program. RBR also offers "dual credit" courses in 16 areas, including nationally recognized programs developed in partnership with Rutgers and Syracuse Universities in writing, health sciences, and mathematics.

Red Bank Regional provides one of the most comprehensive athletic programs in Monmouth County. Most of our teams offer Freshmen, JV, and Varsity levels. In addition, the school's 38 clubs and activities offer students a wide range of options to follow their passions and enhance their academic experience.

Recently, the *Washington Post* identified RBR as one of the most challenging high schools in the United States and Niche.com identified Red Bank Regional as one of the best high schools in New Jersey. In its most recent survey, *NJ Monthly Magazine* ranked RBR number 39 out of 350 public high schools in New Jersey and second in Monmouth County.

Red Bank Regional is committed to helping all students make the most of their talents and abilities. Support programs include summer enrichment programs, student mentoring, and tutoring services. The School Counseling department helps students gain the maximum benefit from the high school experience. The SOURCE, RBR's School Based Youth Services Program, is committed to supporting the mental health, well-being, and educational success of all students through comprehensive counseling services, prevention programming, and academic support.

Covid-19 Impact on Red Bank Regional High School

Red Bank Regional School District transitioned to remote instruction on March 16, 2020 due to a state-wide school closure in New Jersey. The following changes were made to our instructional plan:

- Teachers provided synchronous instruction from March June 2020 in a virtual format. Students continued all requirements of the class with the exception of final exams which were eliminated for June 2020.
- For the 2020-21 school year, students accessed instruction through a hybrid model of virtual and in-person learning. As the public health crisis improved, the district shifted to increase in-person learning. After March 2021, students attending school for daily in-person programs increased from 57.6% to 69.1%. In mid-May, the district shifted to a full-school day schedule. Final exams were reinstated for the 2020-2021 school year.
- No changes were made to our grading policy with the exemption of a minimum floor grade of 50% being instituted for students in danger of failing.
- All students completed our AP exam and IB exam requirements for the 2019-20 and 2020-21 school years. This demonstrates the high-level of resiliency of our students participating in these programs as there was extensive independent work that was necessary to augment the lessons due to the reduced length of student-teacher contact time.
- Athletics and extra-curricular activities were canceled in Spring 2020 but returned with Covid-19 restrictions in August 2020.
- All students, staff and parents were trained in Social Emotional Learning in the Fall of 2021 to help students return to school.
