Testing Updates

The AP Program will invest heavily over the next month in the following ways:

- For the 2019–20 exam administration only, **students can take a 45-minute online free-response exam at home**. Educator-led development committees are currently selecting the exam questions that will be administered.

Testing Updates

- The exam will only include topics and skills most AP teachers and students have already covered in class by early March.
- Colleges support this solution and are committed to ensuring that AP students receive the credit they have worked this year to earn. For decades, colleges have accepted a shortened AP Exam for college credit when groups of students have experienced emergencies.

Devices and Logging on

Students will be able to take these streamlined exams on any device they have access to such as a personal or school issued computer, tablet, or smartphone.

All RBR issued Chromebooks can be used.

Devices and Logging On

Online Testing Accommodations

- Students will be able to hand write or type their responses.
 - Typed responses will be on the secure website
 - Students also will be able to upload a photo via a cell phone
 - Training will be provided for students to learn how to do this with a simulation
- AP exams will be open book/open note **BUT students cannot communicate with other students**

Testing Security

- The exam format and questions are being designed specifically for an at-home administration, so points will not be earned from content that can be found in textbooks or online.
- Each subject's exam will be taken on the same day at the same time, worldwide.
- On test day, students will be required to verify their identity and confirm the work they submitted is their own.

Students Who Violate Exam Security Will Receive Consequences

- Students whose responses mirror online content or other students' submissions will have their scores canceled.
- Students sharing or receiving exam content or exam responses, or engaging in any plans or efforts to provide or gain an unfair advantage, will be blocked from testing or their AP scores will be canceled. This includes communications or assistance in person, via the Internet, via social media, or by any other means.
- If the College Board determines that a student gained or provided an unfair advantage on an AP Exam, they will notify their high school so the school can choose to take necessary disciplinary action, as appropriate. The College Board will also provide information about the incident to colleges or other organizations to which the student has already sent any College Board scores (including SAT scores)—or to which the student would send scores in the future.
- Students who attempt to gain an unfair advantage also may be prohibited from taking a future Advanced Placement Exam as well as the SAT, SAT Subject Tests, or CLEP assessments.
- Under certain circumstances, the College Board may inform law enforcement of any incident to determine if prosecution of the test taker, or anyone assisting the test taker in misconduct, is warranted.

SAT Updates

April 28th in school SAT Day - Postponed

- The in school SAT will be rescheduled for October 2020 for all current juniors.
- The current juniors who have already signed up for the April exam will be automatically rolled over into the new SAT October roster. Any students who have not signed up and would like to take the October exam can sign up in Guidance when school reopens.

ALL March makeups and May SATs are cancelled

- Students who already registered for May, whose March test centers were closed, or who do not receive March scores because of any irregularities, will receive refunds.

Currently no additional summer dates have been added by college board.
