There are many topics related to **ANY ASPECT of human behavior**. Choose articles of interest. Please summarize both articles and include your opinion in approximately 8-10 sentences. Write in 3rd person point of view and also try to write on

an analytical level, not a report style. Ideas for way to bring your level to a more critical level in an article reaction paper include (but are not limited to):

-value of the information presented-how it can be applied-is it useful information ?

-what else does this relate to?

-how was the information obtained/who published this? Is it credible?

-Do you think this can impact a lot of people or is it specific to one group such as a culture, age group, or people in a specific profession?

These are *not* checklist items, just ideas for what to think about while reading.
