Program Goals

College and Career Readiness:

- Ensure that participating students are academically prepared for college-level and post-secondary coursework.
- Equip students with the necessary skills, knowledge, and confidence to succeed in a college or work environment, encouraging students to aspire to continue to learn the tools needed to secure gainful employment.

Credit Attainment:

- Help students earn credits while still in high school, reducing the time and cost required to complete a certificate program or college degree.
- Ensure that students successfully complete dual enrollment courses and earn transferable credits that can be applied toward their future academic goals.

Program Goals

Personal Development:

- Support the holistic development of students by promoting critical thinking, problem-solving, and communication skills essential for success in college and beyond.
- Provide opportunities for students to explore their interests, passions, and career goals through exposure to a variety of college-level subjects and vocations.

Retention and Success:

- Implement strategies to support student retention and success in college and vocational courses.
- Monitor students' progress and provide timely supports to address academic or personal challenges they may encounter.

Equity and Access:

- Ensure equitable access to college-level coursework and career certificated programs for all students, regardless of socioeconomic status, race, ethnicity, or other demographic factors.
- Address barriers to participation and success in the program, including financial constraints.

Dual Enrollment Courses

English 121 is an introductory writing course in which students learn to create college-level essays. Throughout the semester, students engage in a writing process and learn strategies for composing and revising. Class time is focused on learning about academic essays and applying that knowledge in writing.

College Success Seminar CSSC-105 is a course intended for students who are considering their academic and career pathways. It is particularly recommended for first-year students who are undecided about their major or are considering transfer pathways. This course is designed to promote academic self-efficacy through the identification and development of academic and career plans. Students will participate in research, discussion, and reflection as well as learn to adopt and present an evidence-based stance, and preview careers in practice.

Participation Considerations

- Students need to be a current Sophomore or Junior
- Keep in mind if you have conflicts with a current Academy, Career Center or Vocational School Programming
- Financial Assistance may be available for Brookdale credits

Participation Considerations

- RBR/Brookdale Requirements for Specific Classes
 - ELL - You may need to demonstrate language proficiency
 - Graduation Requirements - If you are behind on credits you may not be able to participate
 - Special Education - As this is a college course with college credit, accommodations will need to be approved by Brookdale.
 - Accommodations can be provided but modifications would not.

Brookdale Eligibility Requirements

- Brookdale requires English Final Grades of 80+ (2 years)
 - Overall GPA of 80
- Brookdale Applications are due by April 8th
 - RBR will provide assistance on **3/28** and **4/3**
 - Release of Information may be needed
- Upon acceptance from Brookdale, course registration will take place at RBR



RBR Requirements

All participating students must review and sign a contract outlining the expectations for successful participation.

This contract clearly defines requirements related to:

- Academic performance in both RBR and Brookdale courses
- Attendance
- Conduct
- Successful completion of programming is required for any tuition assistance
